BRV Newsletter info from Beth Koller

Initially I will print the newsletter as a simple WORD document, possibly transformed into a PDF. If I can get other masthead information, or a scanned image of the logo, I may incorporate that later. The goal is to release a newsletter at least four times a year.

Any information that members can get to me 2-4 months in advance would be great so that we do not have stale-dated material in the newsletter. Announcements on releases or other activities (e.g., races, paddling programs such as the National Paddling Film Fest, conservation programs, safety classes, club parties/picnics) also will be delineated chronologically in a quick reference calendar section. This information will be forwarded to the webmaster to keep the site alive and interesting, given CCA's reported 35% membership increase with improvement of its website. Articles that are not time-sensitive may be saved as later filler.

Articles can be long or short. Article text can be written directly in an email or submitted as a WORD document. Article pictures should be submitted as a JPG in SRGB color format (if you are shooting in JPG this is the format it will be) with pixel dimensions 1024 x 786 at the highest quality available. If you are willing to have the pictures forwarded to the webmaster for display on the web to help keep it updated, please let me know. Some size adjustments may be needed, but these will not be necessary for you to do.

I am looking for folks to:

- Provide trip announcement information
- Provide trip report information, along with any available pictures (do members have any Week of River reports from WV or NC?)
- Provide a list of meeting dates and locations
- Provide information on meeting programs
- Provide information on the dues and to whom to send them (and if they can be paid via PayPal on the website)
- Provide information on a featured member
- Provide information on conservation activities or legal/access rights issues
- Provide officer reports (can be very short)
- Include gear for sale or gear wanted

This list may be expanded.

Please ask people to complete the EXCEL spreadsheet that will be the format for the enduring roster so that Rick and I can complete the document and Ginny can update the dues status category.

What I'd like to focus on now is creating a user-friendly social media presence for those BRV members so inclined and other interested paddlers. For those of you who are on Facebook, I have initiated a BRV Facebook group. It is a closed group, with me as the moderator. From the Facebook website on a computer*, go to the menu (should be the icon in the lower right of your window). There you should find a heading for Groups beneath your Friends. Select Groups, then use the Search Groups text entry window at the top to find "Friends of the Blue Ridge Voyageurs." I will accept your membership request, then you can access the site to view or post at any time. This is an easy way to add trip photos with captions (or even attach a full trip report file), check-in from rivers near and far, organize impromptu trips, post announcements, questions, etc. I don't expect many issues with posting inappropriate content since I control the membership. (Membership in the group is not tied to BRV club membership; any interested paddler can join.)

I have posted a few "vintage" BRV items to the group, including the first BRV newsletter Bridget and I edited in January 1993. Believe it or not, the incoming President that year was none other than current President Rick Koller — check out the group to see his inaugural Prez Put-in and a fun trip down memory lane.

*The Facebook app on a mobile device may work slightly differently. For those not yet on Facebook, go to www.facebook.com and follow the prompts to set up a free account. You can control your privacy settings to be as strict or open as desired.

About the Blue Ridge Voyageurs (BRV)

The **BRV** is a voluntary association of experienced paddlers from the Washington, DC area. Club benefits include: trips for all skill levels (most at intermediate and advanced levels); BRV website and hotline for information and pick-up trips; *The Voyageur*, published 4 times a year; club roster, published yearly in March; holiday party; conservation projects; moonlight paddles & picnics; big trips to the Smokies, Canada, Europe, and Western rivers.

Meetings: BRV will hold meetings from 7-9 pm on dates to be scheduled in the following months: January, March, May, September and November. Meetings are followed by beer and pizza at a nearby pub.
